Brief History of UMW

The roots of United Methodist Women began 150 years ago in Boston. Eight women responded to missionaries in India who voiced the need for female physicians and educators in that country where culturally, men could not see female patients and where schools for girls were non-existent. These eight women organized and began soliciting funds to support the training of two females to be a doctor and an educator. With the help of others, the doctor and the educator began a hospital and a school in India that still exists today. Our FUMC United Women's group had its origins in 1889 as the Parsonage Aid Society with 18 members at Hillsville Methodist Church. They met monthly and paid 20 cents per month to be a member. Mission money in the 1920's and 30's was raised by the "Lord's Eggs" -- those with chickens donated all eggs laid on Sunday to the Mission Society for sale. Today mission, fellowship, and spiritual growth are our purpose. Our local projects include: Valentine Goodie boxes for college students and military, bags of toiletries for homebound adults, overseeing collection and distribution of socks/underwear to local elementary schools, mission money to local person(s) in need, an annual United Methodist Women's worship service, and a Community Christmas luncheon for Senior adults.
